## Raw Materials – What Do I Order?

Copper & Brass	Wire, rod, sheet	Can be found at some hardware stores. Gauges are the same.
Silver	Sterling Silver Sheet	Most is sold in 6" by a length of your choice. Dead soft means that has not been hardened, a good choice if you are going to solder. (example – Rio Item #: 100320 – 20-gauge sterling silver <b>dead soft</b> )
	Sterling Silver Wire	20 gauge is common for ear wires (or 19 gauge if you prefer something stiffer).
	Fine Silver Bezels	Fine silver bezel wire – typically 28g fine silver, NOT sterling (example: Rio Grande Item Number: 101001)

## Basic Tools for work at home

Saw Blades (typically 2/0 or 4/0 size is adequate)	110302 (this is size 2/0)
Metal Hammer (there are many kinds – to start, a hardware store hammer is good, with a ball peen as extra valuable)	112205
Non-metal Hammer (delrin/rawhide)	112215, 112800
Steel bench block	112560
Files (there are many kinds – to start, a hardware store 'bastard' file is good, one flat and one $\frac{1}{2}$ round as extra valuable)	114302 (this is a cut #4, which is finer than a cut #2 – hardware store is usually quite coarse)
Sand paper – coarse (near 280), medium (near 400), fine (near 600-800)	337337 (this is 280 grit)
Various pliers – round, flat, chain nose, wire cutter
